


Cannizaro Park Oak Trees

OAK TREES IN CANNIZARO PARK

Cannizaro Park has a fine collection of oak tree species, which have varied leaf types. They can be deciduous, evergreen or semi-evergreen and come in many different shapes and sizes.

Here is a selection for you to discover as you walk around the park:

1 CHESTNUT-LEAVED OAK (Quercus castaneifolia v. 'Greenspire') Deciduous Leaves look like those of a sweet chestnut	2 SCARLET OAK (Quercus coccinea) Deciduous Leaves with deep, whisker-toothed lobes, intense red in autumn	
3 TURNER'S OAK (Quercus x turneri 'Pseudoturneri') Semi-evergreen Leaves with forward- pointing rounded lobes	4 HUNGARIAN OAK (Quercus frainetto) Deciduous Large leaves to 25 cm, elaborately cut into, with narrow, rounded lobes	
5 DAIMYO OAK (Quercus dentata) Deciduous Very large leaves 25-40 cm and thick as parchment	6 CALIFORNIAN LIVE OAK (Quercus agrifolia) Semi-evergreen Glossy leaves	
7 LUCOMBE OAK (Quercus x hispanica 'Lucombeana') Semi-evergreen Glossy leaves	8 ENGLISH OAK (Quercus robur) Deciduous This tree is included on the Woodland Trust Ancient Tree Inventory	
9 RED OAK (Quercus rubra) Deciduous Large leaves with shallow lobes having 2 or more whiskered teeth	10 WILLOW OAK (Quercus phellos) Deciduous Willow-like leaves	
11 HOLM OAK (Quercus ilex) Evergreen Leaves untoothed, light green when new in spring, but then darkening	12 CORK OAK (Quercus suber) Evergreen Leaves have small, often spiny lobes
